Bee Family Centennial Farm Museum 2012 Annual Report

The Bee Family Centennial Farm Museum is a 501c(3) nonprofit organization established in 2005 to preserve the architecture and artifacts of the Bee Farm while educating the public on farming life and methods past and present. The farming history of Northern Colorado will be shared with others in a traditional, engaging and authentic way.

Visitors

The farm museum is open on Fridays and Saturdays from 9am to 4 pm. This year there were 296 Friday and Saturday visitors. We hosted 8 children's groups for a total of 242, and 5 adult groups with a total of 131. There were 252 visitors that attended 3 special events, making a total of 916 visitors for 2012.

Groups

Two of the larger children's groups this year were the second graders from Eyestone Elementary at Wellington, and Silver Creek Base Camp from Thornton. Some of the adult groups were ladies from the Colorado Farm Bureau Women's Leadership Conference, teachers from the National Ag in the Classroom Conference, seniors from the Broomfield Senior Center, and volunteers from the Fort Collins Welcome Center.

Knitscene Magazine also used the farm for a photo shoot for their winter issue.

Events participated in

Bob and LeeAnn Bee represented the farm in the Wellington 4th of July Parade. Liz and Rich Harrison had a booth at the Poudre Landmarks Foundation 4th of July event at the Avery House.

Special Events

We did a fundraising event on May 12 to begin raising money to put in public restrooms. A live and silent auction was held with donations from local business and supporters. Nine business and groups had booths, and food was sold to raise additional funds. Everyone enjoyed the day in spite of the cool weather.

The Pioneer Living Day was held on June 23. Some of our presenters were not able to come but new attractions were miniature hay stacking equipment by Ray Dirks, and goat herding by Val Manning. David Harrison had a photo booth. The Agrium Seed Survivor trailer was present for the Barn Raising and Pioneer Living Day.

Wellington won the baseball game 22 to 14 this year. The Northern Colorado Model A Club brought antique cars and gave a few visitors rides. We did our own concessions this year and the Virginia Dale Stage Station had a booth.

Volunteers

Nearly 1900 volunteer hours from 15 volunteers made the museum possible again this year. A group of 7 CSU students with Slice did touch up painting, and 25 people from the Rocky Ridge 4-H Club helped do clean up in the spring.

Fred and Joan Henderson, who have been faithful volunteers for several years, moved back to Texas this fall.

Matt Holdridge volunteered this summer with the animals and garden.

Education

Signage was made with pictures and information to go with the antique farm equipment. We added a miniature cow corral where children can feed cows and a bean identification board. Five big posters, that were donated by Farm Bureau Dist 1, were hung with the crop information. Colorado Foundation for Agriculture donated 3, 8ft X 12ft, posters and self standing frames to put them on. We still need to get them up.

Information was added to the web site on how we meet some of the state educational standards. We had a special Water 2012 display for two weeks in September.

Animals

Our livestock are enjoyed by many visitors. We had two beef calves this year, but had to sell the old brown cow. She quit eating when the weather got hot. A wild turkey was donated to the farm and we bought 3 Nargansa turkeys. A mother sheep and two lambs were purchased, but the mother was sold after a month. These along with the yearling Jersey calf, cocoa, and chickens made up the farm animals for this year.

Collection

Arleigh Bee's Model T Ford, now owned by Beth Bee, returned to the farm this year. It is a fun addition. An overshot hay stacker was donated. It is in need of some major repair, but will also be a great addition.

Maintenance

Touch up painting was done on some of the buildings.

Gift Shop

The gift shop is slowly growing. We added promotional items of magnets, key chains, and bumper stickers. A Farm Anatomy book, and children's items were also added.
